AN ORDINANCE TO PREVENT HORSES CATTLE AND OTHER ANIMALS FROM RUNNING AT LARGE

The Village Council of Plato Do Ordain as Follows:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any horse, mule, ass, goat, sheep or any domestic cattle, to be permitted or suffered to run at large within the limits of of the Village of Plato, and every such animal shall be impounded in any common or public pound in said village, and shall not be released therefrom until the owner or some person in his behalf shall pay such fee and charge as are prescribed by the general law of the State.

Section 2. When any animal as aforesaid is impounded, the pound master of the Village, shall proceed therewith as is prescribed by general law: provided that all monies in his hands shall be paid over to the Village treasurer.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication.
