

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING UNREASONABLE ACCELERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES IN THE CITY OF PLATO AND SETTING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

The City Council of the City of Plato Ordains:

Section 1. No person shall start or unreasonably accelerate any motor vehicle with an unnecessary exhibition of speed on any public or private way within the City of Plato. Unreasonable accelerations is herein defined and is prohibited.

Section 2. Unreasonable acceleration of a motor vehicle is hereby defined as acceleration with out apparent reason, and accomplished in such a manner as to cause squealing or screeching sounds by the tires of said vehicle or both.

Section 3. Prima facie evidence of such unnecessary and unreasonable acceleration shall be squealing or screeching sounds emitted by the tires or the throwing of sand or gravel by the tires of said vehicle or both.

Section 4. Penalty: Any person violating any provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not to exceed \$100.00.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
